### Administration Legislative Wins

#### **Maryland Police Accountability Act of 2021 - Baltimore City - Control of the Police Department of Baltimore City (SB 0789/HB 1027) Passed **BMS****

This bill establishes the procedures by which control of the Baltimore Police Department will transfer from the State to the City contingent on the passage of an amendment to the Baltimore City Charter.

#### **Baltimore Regional Neighborhood Initiative Program Fund (SB 0699/HB 0867) Passed **BMS****

This bill makes BRNI funds a permanent \$12 million appropriation in the State general fund.

#### **Baltimore City - Visit Baltimore - Appropriation Calculation (SB 0789/HB 1301) Passed **BMS****

This bill alters the calculation of the City's appropriation to Visit Baltimore for fiscal years 2023-2027.

#### **Baltimore City - Speed Monitoring Systems - Interstate 83 (HB 0967) Passed **BMS****

This bill authorizes the City to place two speed cameras on I-83, subject to signage and real-time display of traveling speed.

### Administration Budget Wins

#### **Perkins Somerset Oldtown Redevelopment Project **BMS****

· \$10.0M (Capital) Secured for an ongoing project that will transform a 244-acre footprint of the City that has experienced years of disinvestment into a diverse and sustainable community of choice.

#### **Community Parks and Playgrounds – Baltimore City – Indoor and Outdoor Park Infrastructure **BMS****

· \$10.0M (Capital) Secured “to design, construct and capital equip park infrastructure and other capital-eligible projects that enhance recreational amenities, including but not limited to trails, playgrounds, and recreational facilities.”

#### **Renovations to City Swimming Pool Facilities **BMS****

· \$3.0M (PAYGO) Secured to match funding provided by the City to move forward with much needed pool renovation projects.

#### **Baltimore City – Greenway Trail **BMS****

· \$1.5M (Capital) Secured to help close the funding gap needed to complete the 35-mile Baltimore Greenway Trail project which will ultimately link 75 of the City's diverse communities, anchor institutions, and tourist destinations through a safe, open-space, trail network.

## Additional City Legislative Highlights

### **Transportation - Maryland Transit Administration Funding and MARC Rail Extension Study - Transit Safety and Investment Act (SB 0199/HB 0114) Passed BCDP**

This bill alters and extends provisions of the Maryland Metro/Transit Funding Act that require operating and capital spending for the Maryland Transit Administration. It also requires the Maryland Department of Transportation to conduct a Western Maryland Area Regional Commuter rail extension study. The bill also establishes a Purple Line Construction Zone Grant Program.

### **Maryland Health Equity Resource Act (SB 0172/HB 0463) Passed BCDP**

This emergency bill establishes a process for designation of Health Equity Resource Communities to target State resources to specific areas in order to reduce health disparities, improve health outcomes and access to primary care, promote prevention services, and reduce health care costs.

### **Historically Black Colleges and Universities -Funding (SB 0001/HB 0001) Passed BCDP**

This bill provides \$557 million to Maryland's four HBCUs from the general funds for fiscal years 2023 through 2032.

### **Enoch Pratt Free Library - Operating Hours and Funding (SB 0477/HB 0436) Passed BCDP**

This bill requires an annual appropriation of \$3 million to Enoch Pratt Free Library to support operating expenses for extended hours and to advance the Library's commitment to equity, inclusion, and greater access to library resources, programs and services.

## Additional City Budget Highlights

### **Comprehensive Flood Mitigation Program – Community of Ednor Gardens-Lakeside**

\$5,000,000 (Capital) Secured for projects that reduce the risk of loss of life and property from flooding on Hillen Road between 35th Street and 36th Street in the Community of Ednor Gardens-Lakeside.

### **Madison Park North Redevelopment**

\$500,000 (Capital) Secured for the Madison Park North Redevelopment Project.

### **Penn Station Redevelopment**

\$4,000,000 (Capital) Secured "for the acquisition, planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, site improvement, and capital equipping of the Baltimore Penn Station Redevelopment project."

### **Warner Street Entertainment District**

\$3,000,000 (Grant) Secured "for the acquisition, planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, site improvement, and capital equipping of properties located on Warner Street, including street improvements, lighting installation, and landscaping."

## BILLS OF INTEREST TO THE ADMINISTRATION BY SUBJECT AREA

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### HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

#### **Baltimore City - West North Avenue Development Authority (SB 0783/HB 1293) Passed BCDP**

This bill establishes a development authority in West Baltimore City to support the development and approval of a comprehensive neighborhood revitalization plan by October 1, 2023.

#### **Neighborhood Business Development Program - Food Desert Projects - Business Retention (SB 0365) Passed**

This bill expands the Neighborhood Business Development Program to include retaining and creating small businesses that provide access to healthy food in “food deserts” and raises the cap on loans.

#### **Baltimore Regional Neighborhood Initiative Program Fund (SB 0699/HB 0867) Passed BMS**

This bill makes BRNI funds a permanent \$12 million appropriation in the State general fund.

#### **Community Development Administration - Live Near Your School Program - Establishment (SB 0637/HB 0943) Passed BCDP**

This bill authorizes the Community Development Administration to administer the Live Near Your School Program to assist current students and recent graduates in receiving low-interest loans to purchase homes near their college or university.

#### **Department of Housing and Community Development - Appraisal Gap From Historic Redlining Financial Assistance Program - Establishment (SB 0859/HB 1239) Passed BCDP**

This bill establishes the above Program and Fund with the purpose of providing financial assistance to home developers working in low-income census tracts to help close “appraisal gaps” in historically redlined neighborhoods.

#### **Local Tax Relief for Working Families Act of 2021 (SB 0133/HB 0319) Passed**

This bill authorizes local governments to impose the county income tax on a bracket basis and requires all local governments to impose a minimum tax rate of 2.25%.

#### **Regional Institution Strategic Enterprise Zone Program - Alterations (SB 0778 /HB 1279) Passed**

This bill expands the purpose of the above program and establishes a rental assistance grant program for qualified businesses

#### **Opportunity Zone Tax Deduction Reform Act of 2021 (SB 0113/ HB 0262) Failed**

This bill requires a person to add back to Maryland adjusted gross income or Maryland modified income the amount of capital gains excluded under the federal Qualified Opportunity Zones Program.



**Alcoholic Beverages - Sale or Delivery for Off-Premises Consumption (SB 0205/HB 0012) Passed**

This bill authorizes a county to allow restaurants and bars to sell or deliver alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption.

**Baltimore City - 40th District Alcoholic Beverages (SB 0755/HB 1288) Failed BCDP**

This bill restricts license holders in specific geographical areas in the 40th alcoholic beverages district in Baltimore City from selling alcoholic beverages before 10am or after 10pm.

**Business Regulation – Battery-Charged Fence Security Systems - Regulation (SB 0135) Passed**

This bill authorizes local government to regulate the installation of battery-charged fence security systems.

**SUSTAINABILITY AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTIONS**

**Environment - Drinking Water Revolving Loan Fund - Use of Funds (SB 0349) Passed**

This bill changes the statute governing the Maryland Drinking Water Revolving Fund to confirm to federal law. It also increases the maximum term limit and amount for loans in disadvantaged communities.

**Department of Agriculture - Urban Agriculture Grant Program (SB 0673/HB 0269) Passed**

This bill establishes Urban Agriculture Grant Program and a fund to support the program.

**Department of the Environment - Office of Recycling - Recycling Market Development (SB 0116/ HB 0164) Passed**

This bill requires Maryland's Office of Recycling to promote the development of markets for recycled materials and products in the State.

**Water Pollution Control - Intervention in Civil Actions - Rights and Authority (SB 0334/HB 0076) Passed**

This bill establishes that a person who meets the requirements of the federal Clean Water Act has an unconditional right and authority to intervene in a civil action initiated by the State to require compliance in water pollution control measures.

**Maryland Paint Stewardship (HB 0127) Failed**

This bill requires a producer of architectural paint sold in the State to submit a plan for the establishment of a Paint Stewardship Program to the Maryland Department of the Environment for approval. It also establishes a uniform paint stewardship assessment to cover program costs.

**Plastic Bag Reduction Act (SB 0223/ HB 0314) Failed BCDP**

This bill prohibits a retail establishment from providing a customer with a plastic carryout bag and establishes a civil penalty for violations.

**Task Force on Recycling Policy and Recycling and Waste Systems in Maryland (HB 0807) Failed**

This bill establishes the above Task Force to review the Maryland Recycling Act and study the recycling and waste systems in Maryland.

## YOUTH AND COMMUNITY INVESTMENT

### **Historically Black Colleges and Universities - Funding (SB 0001/HB 0001) Passed** **BMS, BCDP**

This bill provides \$557 million to Maryland's four HBCUs from the general funds for fiscal years 2023 through 2032.

### **Enoch Pratt Free Library - Operating Hours and Funding (SB 0477/HB 0436) Passed** **BMS, BCDP**

This bill requires an annual appropriation of \$3 million to Enoch Pratt Free Library to support operating expenses for extended hours and to advance the Library's commitment to equity, inclusion, and greater access to library resources, programs and services.

### **Real Property - Impermissible Restrictions on Use - Portable Basketball Apparatuses (HB 1347) Passed**

This bill prohibits unreasonable limitations on the location and use of a portable basketball apparatus on a property in which an individual owns or has exclusive right to use.

## HUMAN SERVICES

### **Commission on LGBTQ Affairs - Established (HB 0130) Passed**

This bill establishes the Commission on LGBTQ Affairs in the Governor's Office of Community Initiatives, sets the Committee purpose and creates reporting guidelines.

### **Criminal Law - Hate Crimes - Protected Groups and Penalties (SB 0220/HB 0128) Passed**

This bill alters the list of protected classes under existing hate crime statutes to include gender identity. It also authorizes a person convicted of a hate crime to complete an antibias education program.

### **Education - Adult High School Pilot Program - Funding and Grants (SB 0630) Passed**

This bill authorizes the above program to provide grants to an adult high school established by a non-profit organization, and provides funds for the program, including the current pilot in Cherry Hill.

### **Growing Family Child Care Opportunities Pilot Program - Established (SB 0711/HB 0944) Passed**

This bill establishes the above pilot program to provide grants to establish and support local programs in the State and creates program requirements.

### **Courts - Surcharges and Payment to Special Funds - Prohibited Lease Provisions (HB 0031) Failed**

This bill increases a surcharge that is applied to specific civil filings in courts and that the surcharges collected be deposited into the Maryland Legal Services Corporation Fund. It also establishes the Rental Assistance Special Fund to provide funding to rent assistance nonprofit organization.

### **Crimes - Mitigation and Defense - Race, Color, National Origin, Sex, Gender Identity, or Sexual Orientation (SB 0046/HB 0231) Failed**

This bill establishes that the discovery or perception of another person's race, color, national origin, sex, gender identity, or sexual orientation, does not constitute legally adequate provocation to mitigate a killing from the crime of murder to manslaughter, and is not a defense to the crime of assault in any degree.

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### **Crimes - Mitigation and Defense - Race, Color, National Origin, Sex, Gender Identity, or Sexual Orientation (SB 0046/HB 0231) Failed**

This bill establishes that the discovery or perception of another person's race, color, national origin, sex, gender identity, or sexual orientation, does not constitute legally adequate provocation to mitigate a killing from the crime of murder to manslaughter, and is not a defense to the crime of assault in any degree.

### **Landlord and Tenant - Repossession for Failure to Pay Rent - Registration and License Information (HB 0523) Failed **BCDP****

This bill requires a landlord filing a written complaint to repossess property due to the failure to pay rent to submit documents that demonstrate compliance with laws and statutes regarding licensure and registration.

### **Workgroup on Screening Related to Adverse Childhood Experiences (SB 0425/HB 0783) Failed**

This bill establishes the above Workgroup and requires the Maryland Department of Health to provide staff.

## **HEALTH EQUITY**

### **Health Facilities - Hospitals - Medical Debt Protection (SB 0514/HB 0565) Passed**

This bill outlines requirements relating to hospital debt collections and payment plans and prohibits a hospital from taking specific actions when collecting debt.

### **Division of Consumer Protection - Assisted Living Programs (SB 0507/HB 0554) Passed**

This bill requires an assisted living program to report specified information to the Consumer Protection Division each year.

### **Human Services - Trauma-Informed Care - Commission and Training - Healing Maryland's Trauma Act (SB 0299/HB 0548) Passed **BMS****

This bill establishes the Commission on Trauma-Informed Care to coordinate a statewide initiative to prioritize the trauma-responsive and trauma-informed delivery of services that affect children, youth, families, and older adults.

### **Local Health Departments - Funding (SB 0563/HB 1123) Passed**

This bill establishes a new base level of State funding for the Core Public Health Services formula and expands the permitted uses of the funds.

### **Maryland Department of Health - Public Health Outreach Programs - Cognitive Impairment, Alzheimer's Disease, and Other Types of Dementia (SB 0313/HB 0119) Passed**

This bill requires the Maryland Department of Health to incorporate information regarding cognitive impairment, Alzheimer's disease, and other forms of dementia into public health outreach programs.

### **Maryland Health Equity Resource Act (SB 0172/HB 0463) Passed **BMS, BCDP****

This emergency bill establishes a process for designation of Health Equity Resource Communities to target State resources to specific areas in order to reduce health disparities, improve health outcomes and access to primary care, promote prevention services, and reduce health care costs.

### **Public Health - Implicit Bias Training and the Office of Minority Health and Health Disparities (SB 0005/HB 0028) Passed**

This bill requires applications for the renewal of a license or certificate issued by a health occupations board to attest to completion of an approved implicit bias training program.

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### **Public Health - Maryland Commission on Health Equity - The Shirley Nathan-Pulliam Health Equity Act of 2021 (SB 0052/HB 0789) Passed **BMS****

This bill establishes the above Commission to employ a health equity framework in examinations, provide advice on issues of racial, ethnic, cultural, or socioeconomic health disparities, and facilitate coordination of expertise and experience in developing a comprehensive health equity plan.

### **Secretary of Health - School-Based Health Centers - Guidelines and Administration of Grants (SB 0830/HB 1148) Passed**

This bill requires the Maryland Department of Health to create a plan to transfer administration of school-based health center grants to the Bureau of Maternal and Child Health by July 1, 2022.

### **State Department of Education and Maryland Department of Health - Maryland School-Based Health Center Standards - Telehealth (SB 0278/HB 0034) Passed**

This emergency bill requires the Maryland State Department of Education and the Maryland Department of Health to authorize a health care practitioner at a school-based health center to provide services through telehealth consistent with provisions of the Health Occupations Article.

### **Maryland Department of Health - Residential Service Agencies - Training Requirements (SB 0275/HB 0141) Passed**

This bill requires residential service agencies to ensure that direct care and supervisory staff receive three hours of training on dementia within 45 days after the start of employment. The bill further requires that staff receive two hours of training regarding Alzheimer's disease and dementia each calendar year.

## **PUBLIC SAFETY AND JUSTICE REFORM**

### **Maryland Police Accountability Act of 2021 - Baltimore City - Control of the Police Department of Baltimore City (SB 789/HB 1027) Passed **BMS****

This bill establishes the procedures by which control of the Baltimore Police Department will transfer from the State to the City contingent on the passage of an amendment to the Baltimore City Charter.

### **Juvenile Law - Juvenile Justice Reform (SB 0853/HB 1187) Passed**

This bill extends the termination date for the Juvenile Justice Reform Council and requires an annual appropriation of at least \$2 million in the annual budget for Roca Baltimore.

### **Maryland Police Accountability Act of 2021 - Police Discipline and Law Enforcement Programs and Procedures (HB 0670) Passed**

This legislation makes several statewide changes related to law enforcement. The bill

1. Repeals of the Law Enforcement Officers' Bill of Rights (LEOBR) and the establishes an accountability and discipline process;
2. Alters requirements for training and certification;
3. Establishes the Maryland Use of Force Statute;
4. Requires law enforcement agencies to use body-worn cameras;
5. Alters provisions regarding search warrants;
6. Establishes two higher education financial assistance programs for officers;
7. Increases civil liability limits applicable to police misconduct lawsuits;
8. Authorizes public disclosure of police disciplinary records;
9. Requires reporting on SWAT team activity and use of force complaints; and
10. Authorizes forfeiture of pension contributions under specified circumstances.

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**Maryland Police Accountability Act of 2021 - Search Warrants and Inspection of Records Relating to Police Misconduct - Anton's Law (SB 0178/HB 0120) Passed**

This bill establishes that a record relating to an administrative or criminal investigation of misconduct by an officer is not a personnel record for Maryland's Public Information Act, thus are not subject to mandatory denial of inspection.

**Maryland Police Accountability Act of 2021 – Office of the State Prosecutor – Investigation of Deaths Caused by Police Officers (SB 0600) Passed**

This bill requires a State's Attorney to send a copy of an investigatory file to the Office of the State Prosecutor when they decide not to prosecute an officer involved in an incident that results in the death of a person.

**Maryland Police Accountability Act of 2021 - Employee Assistance Programs and Early Intervention Programs (SB 0074/HB 0088) Failed**

This bill requires law enforcement agencies to establish early intervention systems, provide access to an employee assistance program for all officers, and develop a policy to provide access to these services at no cost to an officer.

**Maryland Police Accountability Act of 2021 - Law Enforcement Officers - Use of Force, Reporting, and Whistleblower Protections (SB 0626/HB 0139) Failed**

This bill establishes requirements and prohibitions regarding the use of force and criminal penalties for violations. It also establishes whistleblowers protections, creates new training and certification requirements.

**Maryland Police Accountability Act of 2021 - Law Enforcement Officers' Bill of Rights - Repeal and Procedures for Discipline (SB 0627) Failed**

This bill repeals LEOBR and establishes procedures for disciplining law enforcement officers. It also creates training programs related to misconduct investigations and requires information to be submitted to the Governor and General Assembly.

**Baltimore City - Police Officers - Promotional Appointments (SB 0752/HB 1316) Passed**

This bill alters the procedures used by the Police Commissioner to award promotional appointments.

**Public Information Act - Inspection of Records From Body-Worn Digital Recording Devices (SB 0690) Failed**

This bill sets forth the circumstances under which a custodian of records must deny or allow inspection of recordings from a body-worn digital recording device worn by a law enforcement officer.

**State Government - Protection of Information - Revisions - Maryland Data Privacy Act (SB 0351) Failed**

This departmental bill expands and enhances the security protocols that govern the collection, processing, sharing and disposal of personal information by the State and local governments.

**Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services and State Board of Elections- Centralized Booking Facility - Ballot Drop Box (SB 0525) Passed **BCDP****

This bill requires the Baltimore City central booking facility to provide a secure, designated ballot drop box for eligible voters to easily submit absentee ballots applications, ballots, and registration.

## PANDEMIC RESPONSE AND SUPPORT

### **Baltimore City - Visit Baltimore - Appropriation Calculation (SB 0789/HB 1301) Passed **BMS****

This bill alters the calculation of the City's appropriation to Visit Baltimore for fiscal years 2023-2027.

### **Emergency Medical Services - Paramedics - Vaccination Administration (SB 0067/HB 1313) Passed**

This emergency bill authorizes a paramedic to administer a vaccination, in accordance with CDC guidelines.

### **COVID-19 Testing, Contact Tracing, and Vaccination Act of 2021 (SB 0741/HB 0836) Passed**

This emergency bill requires the Maryland Department of Health to adopt and implement a two-year plan to respond to COVID-19 and provide funding to local jurisdictions.

## EMPLOYEE PROTECTIONS

### **Education - Community Colleges - Collective Bargaining (SB 0746/HB 0894) Passed**

This bill establishes a collective bargaining process for certain community college employees.

### **Sheriff of Baltimore City (SB 0914) Passed**

This bill authorizes deputy sheriffs and court security officers to collectively bargain.

## TRANSIT EQUITY AND SAFETY

### **Baltimore City - Speed Monitoring Systems - Interstate 83 (HB 0967) Passed **BMS****

This bill authorizes the City to place two speed cameras on I-83, subject to signage and real-time display of traveling speed.

### **Transportation - Maryland Transit Administration Funding and MARC Rail Extension Study - Transit Safety and Investment Act (SB 0199/HB 0114) Passed **BMS, BCDP****

This bill alters and extends provisions of the Maryland Metro/Transit Funding Act that require operating and capital spending for the Maryland Transit Administration. It also requires the Maryland Department of Transportation to conduct a Western Maryland Area Regional Commuter rail extension study. The bill also establishes a Purple Line Construction Zone Grant Program.

### **Baltimore City - Complete Streets Program Funding - Traffic and Vehicle Monitoring Systems (HB 0226) Failed **BCDP****

This bill expressly authorizes Baltimore City to use any fines collected by the City as a result of violations from automated enforcement systems to be used to administer the systems and requires any remaining funds to be used for public safety or transportation infrastructure improvements consistent with the purpose and goals of the Complete Streets Transportation System.

### **Motor Vehicles - Speed Limits - Establishment and Enforcement (HB 0941) Failed **BMS****

This bill authorizes Baltimore City to decrease or raise to a previously established level the maximum speed limit on a highway under its jurisdiction without performing an engineering and traffic investigation.

If the Governor does not act on a bill that has been presented within 20 days of adjournment of the General Assembly by signing it into law or vetoing it, the bill will automatically become law.
